

GREYSBROOKE PRIMARY SCHOOL JOINS THE FIGHT AGAINST CANCER

Greysbrooke school is adding Cancer Research UK's Race for Life Schools to our timetable for the spring term.

We were planning on hosting a special event on the school's playing fields on Tuesday 24^{th} March, during the school day, as part of the Race for Life Schools programme, however Coronavirus put a stop to that. The new date for this event is <u>TUESDAY</u> 10^{TH} NOVEMBER.

Every class, will unite with friends, teachers and teaching assistants, for a run, walk or skip over a set distance on the school grounds and raise money for life-saving research.

To help the pupils prepare, we will be using a resource kit created by Cancer Research UK, which includes everything needed to hold our own Race for Life Schools event, such as a just giving page, back sign, a finish tape and special medals for every student taking part.

Here at Greysbrooke, we believe Race for Life Schools is a great addition to our school timetable. We are really looking forward to taking part and have been training during our daily mile and PE lessons. The whole school is supporting the event, so it will be a real team effort and a great day for pupils and staff.

Sadly, most of us know someone whose life has been touched by cancer. By putting on our Race for Life Schools event, we can help make a difference and raise money for Cancer Research UK's crucial work. Cancer Research UK's Race for Life, in partnership with Tesco, is an inspiring series of events which raises millions of pounds every year to help beat cancer by funding crucial research.

If every child were to raise just £2 each this could help fun 5 DNA nucleotides which are chemical building blocks that make up a strand of DNA or 2 sets of fluorescent particles that scientists use to light up cancer cells.

Today 2 in 4 people survive cancer - the aim is for 3 in 4 people to survive by 2034.
